


In complete contrast to the South, the Northern part of Cameroon is an area dominated by savannah and grasslands. This type of landscape which stretches as far as the eye can see, is broken up in the North-West by the volcanic dykes of the Kapsiki, in the Mount Mandara mountain range, scenery that is often considered to be some of "the noblest in the World". In this region you can find wild animals roaming peacefully in the National Parks.





Palaces of the Sultans of Kousseri, Logone Birni, Goulfey, Makari, Afadé, **Voulki and Bogo**

Situated 35 km (22 miles) from Kousséri All these sultanates have links with the Sao civilisation. The Sultanate of Logone Birni is of special interest as the birthplace of Hanibal Abraham, an ancestor of Vladimir Poutine, ex-President and current Prime Minister of Russia.

The other sultanates are to be found in the sub-divisions which bear their names.

NATIONAL PARKS

The Waza National Park

120 km (75 miles) from Maroua, on the road to Kousséri

170.000 ha (420,070 acres) of the richest biosphere reserve teeming with different animal species.

Famous all over the world. Wide, open panoramic views and trails.

The Kalamaloué National Park

15 km (9,5 miles) from Kousseri 45.000 ha (111,195 acres), wellendowed with various animal species. point for different countries having common Lake Chad as a border.

- fire-arms dating back to the German colonial period.



PEAKS, MOUNTAINS AND NATIONAL PARKS

The Koza Pass

In the sub-division of Koza, on the Mora Mokolo road

Spectacular cliff-face stretching over a distance of 12 km (7,5 miles). Cut into its rugged relief are the traditional mountain-dwellers huts which mingle in



with the terraced plantations and surrounding rocks. Halfway along the cliff, at Dliglya, a tourist centre has been developed which houses a craft centre, a museum and a welcome centre.

The Rhumsiki Peak

In the sub-division of Mogodé, 50 km (31 miles) from Makolo

A world famous site for tourism in Cameroon, this is the most spectacular peak in the Kapsiki region where the peaks all ressemble mushrooms on a tray. The history and culture of the neighbouring people are closely linked with this peak.

The Ziver Mountain

In the sub-division of Mokolo.

The Dimeo Plateau In the sub-division of Mokolo

The Mozoko Gokoro National Park

In the sub-division of Koza, on the road between Mora and Mokolo in the Mayo Moskota


Craft centre, local art museum central market and tanneries

In the sub-division of Gueré, 58 km (36 miles) from Yagoua Natural lake which stretches as far as Chad where it becomes Lake Fianga. It has a large hippopotamus herd. It forms the shape of a duck's beak at the northernmost point of Cameroon.

Maroua "Maroua" Safari Tour (4 day trip) Departure point: Yaoundé

Yaoundé to Maroua by plane, I 400 km (875 miles), 2 h. Installation at the Mizao Hotel (3*), lunch, dinner and the night.

Day 2 Breakfast at the Mizao Hotel and departure for Waza National Park, 120 km (75 miles) on tarred road,

Arrival and installation in the camp at Waza.

Safari in the park (3h) Return to camp for dinner and the night.

Day 3

Breakfast and return to Maroua with a stop at Mora, 80 km (50 miles) from Waza, Ih drive.

Day I Breakfast at the Mizao

Arrival in Mora, visit to the Lamido's Sare of Mora (30 mins)

for Oudjila, Departure 12 km (7,5 miles), 30 minutes from Mora by track. Arrival and visit of the chieftainry, traditional dances performed by the chief's wives (1h30) and cold meal.

Continue to Mokolo, 60 km (37,5 miles) from Oudjila, 2h on untarred road across the Mozogo Goroko National Park and the Koza Pass with a stop at Djingliya to visit the craft centre.

Arrrival at Mokolo, tour of the city and 30 minute halt at the Le Flam-boyant camp. Departure for Rhumsiki, 48 km (30 miles) along wel tained track (1h30). vell-main-

Arrival at Rhumsiki (lunar landscape) at about 17h to watch the sunset, installation, dinner and the night in the camp.

5h30: Watch the sunrise over Rhumsiki and breakfast in the camp.

Visit of the lunar village, the Sorceror of the Crabs, weavers and potters.

Departure for Mokolo and return to Maroua, 80 km (50 miles) on tarred road,

Arrival in Maroua in the afternoon and installation at the Mizao Hotel.

Tour of the city (market, craft centre, tannery, mosque and the Lamida of Maroua).

Return to the Mizao Hotel, for a meal and the night. End of tour.

"Maroua-Kaélé" Tour

(I day trip)

Departure point: Maroua

Breakfast at the Mizao Hotel (3*) and departure for Mindif, 25 km (15.5 miles) from Maroua, 30 minute trip on untarred road.

Arrival in Mindif. Visit to the Lamido's Sare and the Peak of Mindif. Departure for Lara, 26 km (16 miles) along track (30 minute

journey). Arrival in Lara, tour of the town and its picturesque lansdcape, dances by Win-gou and Moudang war-riors in Ngambour and visit of the crocodile pool. Departure from Lara to Kaélé, 12 km (7,5 miles), 30 minute trip. Observation of the picturesque landscape. Arrival in Kaélé and tour of the town (chieftainry, traditional site for the rites of Djidoma and Lake Zapazon). Cold meal.

In the afternoon, return to Maroua via the N°1, 36 km (22,5 miles), then the Kaélé-Maroua route, 68 km (42,5 miles) on tarred road, Ih. Arrival in Maroua, tour of

the city and end of trip.

9h: Arrival in Maga and visit of the rice paddies (agrotourism), 1h30. 10h30: Departure from

Maga to Pouss, 13 km (8 miles) on untarred road, 20 minute trip and visit to the Lamido of Pouss' Sare and the welcome centre



of Mourla, 4 km (2,5 miles) from Pouss.

12h: Return to Maga by the same route
